SPEAR is a program run to save "one life one day at a time." This suicide-prevention program was started 7 years ago and is open to youth between the ages of 12-17 in the county. SPEAR works with kids one-on-one with psychiatrists and counselors, focusing solely on the child, not the entire family. The youth is enrolled in a class to build self-esteem and uncover hidden talents. The classes perform plays for the public and work with other types of art to gain public speaking and other important skills, as well as simply boosting self esteem. This program also holds seminars for parents to notice and prevent suicide in children. Depressed teens are not the only ones who can get involved with SPEAR; however, any teen interested in the class can participate and get involved in the community through volunteering, which this group needs a lot of. So far, SPEAR has directly saved 9 lives and is eager to help any lost or depressed teen, so that one more tragic death is prevented. The language spoken is English and the program is free for anyone interested.

Youth advocate against tobacco and work to make changes in the community. Yak-So understands that smoking is leading cause of preventable death in the US and that every day in the U.S. 6,0000 youth try their first cigarette, so they take action to educate youth on the dangers of tobacco use, they work to strengthen policy in our community, they network with youth in other counties and they help enforce laws. Overall, Yak-So offers youth the opportunity to take action in the fight against tobacco use by participating in undercover tobacco sting operations, Youth Quest rally at the State Capitol, Youth Summit (annual summer conference), partner with CYAN (California Youth Advocacy Network) on statewide coalition and they collaborate with FUSION (California's own statewide youth movement against the tobacco industry). The Arts Council of El Dorado County was formed around 1986 with the purpose of acting as a catalyst to enrich and educate the community through the advancement of all the art mediums: drama, dance, singing, drawing, painting, writing, sculpture, etc. The Arts Council funds their programs with help from El Dorado County, from grants, and from members. It runs a variety of programs throughout the years, but its main program is the Arts Bank Program. Through this project, student artists submit a resume with some of their work, and after reviewing it, the Arts Council pairs them with an art teacher to help them develop their talent. The Arts Council also brings the Oregon Shakespeare Festival down to Union Mine High School for a workshop and training with some of their actors. Fall of 2005, the Council also plans to run "A Day in the County," a program in which artists from the area are matched with students for a 4-6 week class. When the class ends, the students' work is displayed for all to see in an exhibit. Anyone in junior or senior high that lives in the county can participate in any of the Art Council's programs; they only need to talk with their art teacher or contact the Arts Council to express an interest in involvement. This council occasionally needs volunteers for various things like writing newspaper articles, helping mail flyers, the summer concert series, etc. The language spoken is English and the program is free.
